I am a great supporter of medical simulation and practice it in my teaching activities, but I see an important role in observing the performance of medical procedures in a clinical setting and the performance of medical procedures by learners, under the supervision of an experienced mentor. On the issue of parents' participation in the observation of simulation scenarios - I am not convinced that this is beneficial for them, as well as whether it is advisable in the learning process of medical personnel. However, the participation of parents in simulation scenarios regarding emergencies in non-hospital conditions can be considered, it would be practical to prepare them for the care of a premature baby after discharge home.
